daughter, son-in-law and daughter with whom he had lived for many years
until death at the age 95. 85
My father worked as a baker in Philadelphia, Coatesville and for many
years with William Barrett Bakery , Downingtown., included plain bakery,
fancy pasteries and ice cream.
